
Collect

THERE IS NO NEED FOR ME TO WRITE TO YOU ABOUT THIS SERVICE TO THE SAINTS. For I know your eagerness to help, and I have been boasting about it to the Macedonians, telling them that since last year you in Achaia were ready to give; and your enthusiasm has stirred most of them to action. But I am sending the brothers in order that our boasting about you in this matter should not prove hollow, but that you may be ready, as I said you would be. For if any Macedonians come with me and find you unprepared, we--not to say anything about you--would be ashamed of having been so confident. So I thought it necessary to urge the brothers to visit you in advance and finish the arrangements for the generous gift you had promised. Then it will be ready as a generous gift, not as one grudgingly given.

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 8 And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. As it is written:

"They have scattered abroad their gifts to the poor; their righteousness endures forever."

Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God. This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of the Lord's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God.

2 Corinthians 9:1-12

AS JESUS SAW THE CROWDS, HIS HEART WAS FILLED WITH PITY FOR THEM, because they were worried and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. So he said to his disciples,

"The harvest is large, but there are few workers to gather it in. Pray to the owner of the harvest that he will send out workers to gather in his harvest."

Jesus called his twelve disciples together and gave them authority to drive out evil spirits and to heal every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon (called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James and his brother John, the sons of Zebedee; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew, the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Patriot, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Jesus.

"On the first day of every week each of you is to put something aside and store it up...." (1 Cor 16:2)

All: **Lord, may we be disciplined in our giving.**

Under the test of this service you will glorify God by your obedience in acknowledging the Gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your contribution." (2 Corinthians 9:13)

All; **Lord, may we be obedient in this aspect of its teaching.**

"Give and it will be given to you; good measure, pressed down, shaken together running over, for the measure you give will be the measure you get back..." (Luke 6:38)

All: **Lord, may we be grateful for your amazing generosity to us and for your promises to us.**

"First they gave themselves to the Lord...." (2 Corinthians 8:5)

All: **Lord, may we give you our whole lives as a worthy offering out of gratitude for all your goodness to us.**

May the Holy Spirit who gives gifts to all people, flood your hearts with thanksgiving to God. And the blessing of God Almighty...
