From your Parish Priest

As the days shorten and summer gives way to autumn, churches around the country will hold their annual Harvest Festival celebrations, especially in the rural parishes where so much of our food originates. Yet again, we will give thanks for the bounty of God's wonderful creation, and all the good gifts around us. The coming together of nature's innate fruitfulness and mankind's ingenuity in farming and husbandry means that our world is prolific in its capacity to grow the food we need, for which we will indeed give thanks, as always.

We now take for granted the all-year availability of items which just one generation ago were definitely seasonal, and the majority of people in this country will rarely, if ever, have experienced empty supermarket shelves. Worldwide food production continues to reach record highs for many commodities. The annual yield of cereal crops is 2,600,000,000,000 kilogrammes – which is probably a meaningless figure to most of us, until we see that this represents 375 kilogrammes per year, or just over one kilogramme of grain per day, for every human being on the planet – and that is just cereal production, let alone fruit, meat, and other food stuffs. With the world population still growing, there is no room for complacency, and so we should give thanks for all the continued efforts of those in farming and agriculture to ensure that we have our 'daily bread'. However, the figures show that there is enough food for everyone if we share it properly and avoid waste.

In this country alone, we buy over 40,000,000,000 kilogrammes of food every year, but best estimates suggest that nearly 25% of this goes to waste. Even then, we consume on average around 440 kilogrammes per person per year, which is quite sufficient to feed everyone, and yet growing numbers of people are reliant on food banks. The same conclusion applies - there is enough food for everyone if we share it properly and avoid waste.

Harvest-time is a joyful and proper celebration of thanksgiving for the sheer wonder of God's creation, for the way in which it furnishes all our daily needs, and for all it tells us about God's love towards us – his firm intention that we should have "life in all its fullness". The fact that there are those in our own country, let alone across our world, who will regularly go hungry or suffer malnutrition is very much the collective fault of humanity rather than any shortfall in God's bounty. Let's enjoy and celebrate harvest-time but let's also, in our prayers and in our actions, do all we can to ensure a proper sharing of all that nature affords us, and to avoid waste, so that all may enjoy the fruits of God's creation.

With every blessing at this Harvest-time.

Wildlife Notes

Throughout the summer this year I have been hearing the calls of a Green Woodpecker or Yaffle as it is also known due to its laughing call. It has been a source of irritation that I have not been able to spot the bird responsible but that is probably due to the fact that during the summer they feed mainly on the ground due to their taste for ants. Their long, sticky tongues are adapted to pick up several ants at a time so they like dry patches on lawns where ants nests are common. Hence they are less likely to be seen unless it is your garden they are feeding in. During the winter their diet changes to grubs and insects they come across on old wood so you are more likely to spot them on dead trees or stumps. I was pleased to receive a photo of a green woodpecker taken on the lawn of a Neatishead resident that was clearly of a young green woodpecker showing that they had successfully bred. Terry Kett reports young birds seen near Alderfen as well so perhaps this summer has been a good ant year.

A Barton local had a surprise when he ventured across the border into Neatishead on the 2nd September and spotted a strange bird on a fence near Neatishead Hall Farm. Initially thinking it was a jay he quickly realised that it was a much more exotic bird, a Hoopoe, and got a couple of snaps on his phone to prove it. Bird Guides tell me that there was another one in Lothian, Scotland on the same day and two more in Dorset 3 days later. Sadly our bird did not hang around unlike one at Happisburgh a few years ago that stopped off in a horse paddock for a couple of weeks. These birds were clearly moving through but as they nest as close as France and the Channel Islands perhaps we can expect them to breed in Norfolk in the near future. During October we can expect the winter thrushes to start arriving and on a clear night if you stand outside you can hear the short high pitched contact calls of the Redwings flying overhead. Many of our visiting thrushes and blackbirds come from Scandinavia and travel here to escape the harsher winters over there.

We hold special events at some of our recycling centres so that people can dispose of household hazardous waste free of charge. Your nearest will be at Mayton Wood Recycling Centre, Little Hautbois, Coltishall, NR12 7JX on **Friday 6th, Saturday 7th and Sunday 8th October**, 9am to 4pm

Items we accept during household hazardous waste days:-

Aerosols – full or part-full / Fire extinguishers / Garden pesticides and fertilizers – both liquid and powder form / Household chemicals and cleansers – both liquid and powder form, e.g. carpet cleaner, furniture polish, old bottles of bleach etc. / Paint – including water-based and solvent-based paint / Photographic chemicals / Wood preservatives, treatments and varnishes.

Items we don't accept during household hazardous waste days:-

Ammunition, explosives or marine flares / Asbestos / Commercial (or business, or trade) hazardous waste / Fireworks / Gas canisters (full or part-full) / Petrol.

What to expect when visiting household hazardous waste days and some tips for your visit:-

Keep all products in their original containers. Make sure that all products are properly sealed or bagged to avoid leakage when you transport them. Any empty or dried out paint tins can be disposed of in your bin at home or scrap metal bins at recycling centres (if metal).

These events are very popular so there are likely to be queues when you visit the recycling centre. Please be patient with our recycling team and other site users. Typically first thing it is very busy so we recommend coming later in the day.
